Monday: Check It Out!

Tuesday: Bible Bit

Read Psalm 56:10–11. What reason does the writer of this psalm give for not being afraid? What promises from God's Word do you know that make you want to praise Him?

Wednesday: Bible Bit

Read Psalm 89:1–2. What is the writer of this psalm doing to praise God? How can knowing about God's love help you praise God at all times of your life?

Connecting to Jesus

The jailer had heard Paul and Silas praising God in the middle of the jail, even though they were in a scary and painful situation. Their actions showed their faith and trust in God! So when the jailer discovered that they had not left even though they could have escaped, he wanted to know how he could be saved, too. Just as Paul and Silas did, we can let our faith in Jesus show, even in difficult situations. Then we can tell other people how they can trust in Jesus, too!
